was one of the most iconic victims of the Holocaust. Her diary, written as a teenager from June 1942 to August 1944, describes her life hiding with her family and four other people in an Amsterdam attic. They were denounced on August 4, 1944. She was deported to Bergen-Belsen and perished in February 1945

a 6th-century Byzantine empress married to Emperor Justinian I, is remembered for being one of the most powerful women in Byzantine history. She used her power and influence to promote religious and social policies that were important to her. She was one of the first rulers to recognize the rights of women.

__first woman of color and first Hispanic appointed as Supreme Court Justice of the United States. She was born in Brooklyn, New York, to a Puerto Rican migrant family and studied at both Princeton and Yale universities. During her studies, she was involved in Latino activist groups, such as the Puerto Rican Action Initiative. n 1980, she graduated as a lawyer and began a long and successful career as a awyer and judge. In 2009, she made history as the first woman of color and first Hispanic to be appointed Associate Justice of the United States Supreme Court

______ A former slave became an outspoken advocate for abolition, temperance, and civil and women's rights in the nineteenth century. Her Civil War work earned her an invitation to meet President Abraham Lincoln in 1864.
